### Got COVID or the FLU? The Sick Pay Guarantee is for YOU!

Don't go to work when you're sick. Staying home keeps everyone safe. Eligible casual and self-employed workers can prepare for the Winter flu season by signing up for the Sick Pay Guarantee. If you have to miss work to care for someone who is sick, you can claim too. You can claim for work you have already missed.

It only takes 15 minutes to sign up. Then you can claim sick and carer's pay when you need it.

### Mental Health & Wellbeing Hubs available to all

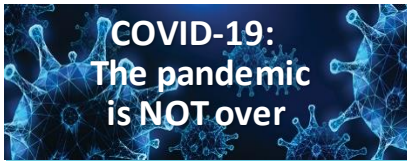


### Multicultural Health Connect caters for all Victorians
