As winter is here, it is important that we keep doing the things that keep us all safe. Ensure you are up to date with your COVID-19 vaccines and that you get vaccinated against influenza.

Free flu vaccinations for all Victorians during June

All Victorians aged six months and over are now eligible for the free flu vaccinations between 1 June and 30 June from their **GP** or **pharmacist**. Free flu vaccinations for all Victorians is a temporary measure, but some priority groups who are most at risk are eligible for free flu vaccination every year. It is safe to get your COVID-19 and influenza vaccinations at the same time.

You are eligible for a COVID-19 vaccine winter dose if you are:

- aged 65+
- a person with severe immunocompromise aged 16+
- a resident of an aged or disability care facility
- an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person aged 50+, or
- a person aged 16 to 64 with:
 - a medical condition that increases the risk of severe COVID-19 illness
 - disabilities with significant, complex or multiple health issues

Eligible people can receive their winter dose **4 months after** receiving their third dose, or from 3 months after having COVID-19 if infection has occurred since the person's third dose.

If you are a person with severe immunocompromise (who is recommended for three primary doses) has already had a fourth dose, getting a winter dose as a fifth vaccine dose will give you improved vaccine protection for winter.

New GP Respiratory Clinics to ease pressure on hospitals

GP Respiratory Clinics (GPRC) provide face-to-face assessment of respiratory symptoms (including COVID-19), testing and immediate treatment. Anyone of any age with a respiratory issue can book an appointment at a GPRC. A Medicare card is not essential, and the service is free. Most clinics are open after-hours and on weekend.




